WARRANT FOR SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
NOVEMBER 13, 1991
COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

To either of the constables of the Town of Templeton in said
County.

GREETING:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the several precincts of the Town of Templeton, County of Worcester, qualified to vote in elections and town affairs to meet in the Narragansett Regional High School, South Main Street, Baldwinville, on November 13, 1991 at 7:00 P.M., then and there to act on the following articles:

Article 1. To see if the Town will vote to Raise & Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds a sum of money for an audit of the Town's financial statements for fiscal year 1991; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Thousand, Three Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$7,375.00) for an audit of the Town's financial statements for fiscal year 1991.
Passed Unanimously

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds a sum of money to pay a Recreation Department FY'91 unpaid bill to U.S. Games; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty-nine Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$39.50) to pay a Recreation Department FY'91 unpaid bill to U.S. Games.
Passed Unanimously

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds a sum of money to pay a Council on Aging FY'91 unpaid bill to Atter's Supermarket inc.; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to Raise and Appropriate the sum of Twenty-five Dollars and Eighty-five Cents (\$25.85) to pay a Council on Aging FY'91 unpaid bill to Atter's Supermarket Inc.
Passed Unanimously

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds a sum of money for renovation and related engineering services for Maple Street Well #1 and for repairs to and replacement parts for the well and pumping equipment; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to Raise and Appropriate the sum of Twenty-three Thousand, Three Hundred Dollars (\$23,300.00) for renovation and related engineering services for Maple Street Well #1 and for repairs to and replacement parts for the well and pumping equipment.
Passed Unanimously

- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept as a gift from Hospital Cottages for Children a piece of land and right-of-way easements located off Hospital Road, being a portion of the property shown on a plan on file in the office of the Board of Selectmen, and further, to see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds a sum of money for the purpose of defraying the Town's costs associated with the land acquisition; said property to be used as the future site for a water storage tank, water main and appurtenances; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept as a gift from Hospital Cottages for Children a piece of land and right-of-way easements located off Hospital Road, being a portion of the property shown on a plan on file in the office of the Board of Selectmen, and further, that the Town vote to Raise and Appropriate the sum of Five Thousand, Seventy-five dollars (\$5,075.00) for the purpose of defraying the Town's costs associated with the land acquisition; said property to be used as the future site for a water storage tank, water main and appurtenances.
Passed Unanimously

- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds, or borrow under the provisions of Chapter 44, or otherwise, the sum of \$164,360 to be used for Highway purposes under Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 90, Section 34(2) (a); said monies being the Town's first allocation of funds pursuant to Chapter 33 of the Acts of 1991, apportioned by the State Department of Public Works and Department of Revenue as available funds for appropriation by the Town; reimbursement of expenditures to the town will be made following receipt of appropriate documentation that costs for the approved project have been incurred; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to borrow under the provisions of Chapter 44, or otherwise, the sum of \$164,360 to be used for Highway purposes under Massachusetts General Laws. Chapter 90, Section 34(2) (a); said monies being the Town's first allocation of funds pursuant to Chapter 33 of the Acts of 1991, apportioned by the State Department of Public Works and Department of Revenue as available funds for appropriation by the Town; reimbursement of expenditures to the town will be made following receipt of appropriate documentation that costs for the approved projects have been incurred.

- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to decrease the sum of money transferred from the Sewer Betterment Available Account to the Maturing Principal on Long Term Debt Account, voted at the Annual Town Meeting on May 14, 1991 as Article 12, and transfer a sum of money from the Reserve for Appropriation Bond Principal Account to the Maturing Principal on Long Term Debt Account; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to decrease the amount of Fifty-five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000.00) transferred from the Sewer Betterment Available Account to the Maturing Principal on Long Term Debt Account by vote at the Annual Town Meeting on May 14, 1991 as Article 12 by Twenty-five Thousand, One Hundred Twenty Dollars and Thirty-two Cents (\$25,120.32) and transfer the sum of Twenty-five Thousand One Hundred Twenty Dollars and Thirty-two Cents (\$25,120.32) from the Reserve for Appropriation Bond Principal Account to the Maturing Principal on Long Term Debt Account.
Passed Unanimously.

- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to decrease the sum of money transferred from the Sewer Betterment Available Account to the Interest on Long-Term Debt Account voted at the Annual Town Meeting on May 14, 1991 as Article 13, and transfer a sum of money from the Reserve for Appropriation Bond Interest Account to the Interest on Long Term Debt Account; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to decrease the amount of Thirty-five Thousand, Seven Hundred Ninety-five Dollars and Eighty-six Cents (\$35,795.86) transferred from the Sewer Betterment Available Account to the Interest on Long-Term Debt Account by vote at the Annual Town Meeting on May 14, 1991 as Article 13 by Fifteen Thousand Ninety-five Dollars and Eighty-six Cents (\$15,095.86) and transfer the sum of Fifteen Thousand, Ninety-five Dollars and Eighty-six Cents (\$15,095.86) from the Reserve for Appropriation Bond Interest Account to the Interest on Long Term Debt Account.
Passed unanimously

- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and appropriate an additional sum of money for the Interest on Bond Anticipation Notes-Phase IVB Sewer Project Account; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to Raise and appropriate an additional sum of Eight Thousand, Three Hundred Thirty-four Dollars and Thirty-seven Cents (\$8,344.37) for the Interest on Bond Anticipation Notes-Phase IVB Sewer Project Account.
Passed unanimously

- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Worcester County Dog Fund receipts to the Boynton Library Expense Account; or to take any other action thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to transfer the sum of Two Thousand, Fifty-three Dollars and Forty-one Cents (\$2,053.41) from the Worcester County Dog Fund receipts to the Boynton Library Expense Account.
Passed unanimously

- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept Sandy Pine Road as a public way, in accordance with the layout approved by the Board of Selectmen, the road being shown on a plan on file with the Town Clerk's Office, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire any necessary easements or fee simple interests through gift, eminent domain, purchase or otherwise; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to accept Sandy Pine Road as a public way, in accordance with the layout approved by the Board of Selectmen, the road being shown on a plan on file with the Town Clerk's Office, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire any

necessary easements or fee simple interests through gift, eminent domain, purchase or otherwise.

Passed unanimously

- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a portion of the Town way known as Reservoir Street and situated within the boundaries of land owned by American Tissue Mills of Massachusetts, Inc., as shown on a plan filed with the Town Clerk on October 15, 1991, entitled "Plan of Discontinuance of a Portion of RESERVOIR STREET in (Baldwinville Village) Templeton, (Worcester County) MA, Scale: 1 inch = 40 feet - September 4, 1991, Szoc Surveyors, 32 Pleasant Street, Gardner, Massachusetts - 01440 - Tel. 1 - (508) 632-0233"; or take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to discontinue a portion of the Town way known as Reservoir Street and situated within the boundaries of land owned by American Tissue Mills of Massachusetts, Inc., as shown on a plan filed with the Town Clerk on October 15, 1991, entitled "Plan of Discontinuance of a Portion of RESERVOIR STREET in (Baldwinville Village) Templeton, (Worcester County) MA, Scale: 1 inch = 40 feet - September 4, 1991, Szoc Surveyors, 32 Pleasant Street, Gardner, Massachusetts - 01440 - Tel. 1-(508) 632-0233."

Passed unanimously

- Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to execute a release or pro tanto receipt for damages for the parcels listed as 3-TS-2, 3-1-T, and 3-1 shown on the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Department of Public Works, Layout No. 6899 dated September 11, 1991; said parcels taken by the Department of Public Works for State Highway purposes in relation to the replacement of Bridge No. T-2-11, Templeton-Depot Road over B & M Railroad; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to execute a release for damages in the amount of \$8,800 plus interest for the parcels listed as 3-TS-2, 3-1-T, and 3-1 shown on the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Department of Public Works, Layout No. 6899 dated September 11, 1991; said parcels taken by the Department of Public Works for State Highway purposes in relation to the replacement of Bridge No. T-2-11, Templeton-Depot Road over B & M Railroad.

Passed unanimously

- Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds a sum of money for the Stabilization Fund; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to Raise and Appropriate the sum of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000) for the Stabilization Fund.

Passed unanimously
