WARRANT FOR SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
OCTOBER 13, 1993
COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

Worcester, ss.

To either of the constables of the Town of Templeton
in said County.

GREETING:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the precincts of the Town of Templeton, County of Worcester, qualified to vote in elections and town affairs to meet in the Narragansett Regional High School, South Main Street (renamed effective 10/1/93, 464 Baldwinville Road), Baldwinville, on October 13, 1993 at 7:00 p.m., then and there to act on the following articles:

Article 1. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds a sum of money for the 1994 revaluation of all real and personal property for FY95 under the direction of the Board of Assessors and further, to meet the triennial certification as required under Chapter 797 of the Acts of 1979; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to Raise and Appropriate the sum of Fifty Thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) for the 1994 revaluation of all real and personal property for FY95 under the direction of the Board of Assessors and further, to meet the triennial certification as required under Chapter 797 of the Acts of 1979.

Passed

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds or borrow under the provisions of Chapter 44 of the General Laws, or otherwise, a sum of money for constructing and equipping an addition to the highway barn, including construction administration and any other related costs; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to Appropriate and Transfer from the Insurance Recoveries Receipts Reserved for Appropriation Account the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) for constructing and equipping an addition to the highway barn, including construction administration and any other related costs.

Passed

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds a sum of money to fulfill the essential changes pursuant to the implementation of the Enhanced 9-1-1 emergency telecommunications system; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to raise and Appropriate the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$1,275.00) to fulfill the essential changes pursuant to the implementation of the Enhanced 9-1-1 emergency telecommunications system.

Passed

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to Appropriate and transfer a sum of money from the Worcester County Dog Fund receipts to the Boynton Public Library Expense Account; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to Appropriate and Transfer the sum of Seven Hundred Seventy-seven Dollars and Eighty-five Cents (\$777.85) from the Worcester County Dog Fund receipts to the Boynton Public Library Expense Account.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following by-law regarding a state of water supply emergency:

"WATER SUPPLY"

Section 1: Authority

This By-law is adopted by the Town of Templeton under its home rule powers, its police powers to

protect public health and welfare and its specific authorization under M.C.L. c.40, s.21 and 21D.

Section 2: Purpose

The purpose of this By-law is to protect, preserve, and maintain the public health, safety and welfare whenever there is in force a state of water supply emergency by providing for enforcement of any duly imposed restrictions, requirements, provisions or conditions imposed by the Town of Templeton or by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection and included in the Town's plan approved by the Department of Environmental Protection to abate the emergency.

Section 3: Definitions

For the purpose of this By-law:

enforcement authority shall mean the Town's Board of Selectmen or Water Department, having responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the water supply, the Health Department, the Town police and the Special police.

state of water supply emergency shall mean a state of water supply emergency declared by the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to G.L. c.21G, section G.L. c. 111, s.160, or by the Governor.

Section 4: The following shall apply to all users of water supplies supplied by the Town.

Following notification by the Town of the existence of a state of water supply emergency, no person shall violate any provision, condition, requirement or restriction included in a plan approved by the Department of Environmental Protection which has as its purpose the abatement of a water supply emergency.

Notification of any provision, restriction, requirement, or condition with which users of water supplied by the Town are required to comply to abate a situation of water emergency shall be sufficient for purposes of this By-Law if it is published in a newspaper of general circulation within the Town or by such other notice as is reasonably calculated to reach and inform all users of the Town supply.

Section 5: Penalty

Any person or entity who violates this By-Law, shall be liable to the Town in the amount of \$50.00 for the first violation and \$100.00 for each subsequent violation which shall inure to the Town for such uses as the Board of Selectmen may direct. Fines shall be recovered by indictment or on complaint before the District Court or by noncriminal disposition in accordance with section 21D of Chapter 40 of the General Laws. Each separate instance of non-compliance following the issuance of any warning or citation pursuant to this section shall constitute a separate violation.

Section 6: Right of Entry

Agents of the enforcement authority may enter any property for purposes of inspecting or investigating any violation of this By-law or enforcing the same, upon obtaining a warrant from a court having jurisdiction over the subject matter and area.

Section 7: Severability

The invalidity of any portion or provisions of this By-law shall not invalidate any other portion, provision or section hereof.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or transfer from Available Funds a sum of money to provide for an engineering study of the Otter River Well to include evaluation of the well and pump, a hydrogeological investigation, treatment alternatives, and any other related engineering study; or to take any other action relative thereto.

A motion was duly made and seconded, the Town transfer from the Preliminary Plans/Municipal Landfill account the sum of Thirty-four Thousand, Four Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$34,480.00) to provide for an engineering study of the Otter River Well to include evaluation of the well and pump, a hydrogeological investigation, treatment alternatives, and any other related engineering study.

Passed

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to Raise & Appropriate, Transfer from the Insurance Recoveries Receipts Reserved for Appropriation Account, transfer from Available Funds or borrow under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 44, or otherwise, a sum of money to purchase a six-wheel truck (cab and chassis), for the purchase and installation on said truck of an all-season body and plow rigging with hydraulic pump system, and also, for the purchase and installation of a calcium chloride assembly; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to Appropriate and Transfer from the Insurance Recoveries Receipts Reserved for Appropriation Account the sum of Seventy-seven Thousand, One hundred Twenty-six Dollars (\$77,126.00) to purchase a six-wheel truck (cab and chassis), for the purchase and installation on said truck of an all-season body and plow rigging with hydraulic pump system, and also, for the purchase and installation of a calcium chloride assembly.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to Raise & Appropriate, Appropriate and transfer from the Insurance Recoveries Receipts Reserved for Appropriation Account, transfer from Available Funds, or borrow under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 44, or otherwise, a sum of money to rehabilitate the 1984 Michigan loader, H-13, and/or the 1973 ten-wheel Mack sander, H-12; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to Appropriate and Transfer from the Insurance recoveries Receipts Reserved for Appropriation Account at the sum of Fifty-nine Thousand, Four Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$59,475.00) to rehabilitate the 1984 Michigan loader, H-13, and the 1973 ten-wheel Mack sander, H-12.

Passed

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to Raise & Appropriate, Appropriate and transfer from the Insurance Recoveries Receipts Reserved for Appropriation Account, or transfer from Available Funds a sum of money to rehabilitate to one vehicle the 1982 GMC one-ton pickup truck, H-10, and the burned 1986 GMC one-ton dump truck, H-14; or to take any other action relative thereto.


