WARRANT FOR SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
JUNE 21, 1994
COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

To either of the constables of the Town of Templeton
in said County.

GREETING:

In the Name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby
directed to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the several pre-
cincts of the Town of Templeton, County of Worcester, qualified
to vote in elections and town affairs to meet in the Narragan-
sett Regional High School, 464 Baldwinville Road, Baldwinville,
on June 21, 1994 at 8:00 P.M. then and there to act on the
following articles:

Article 1. To see if the Town vote to adopt the following
By-Law regarding a state of water supply emergency;

Section 1: Authority

This By-law is adopted by the Town of
Templeton under its home rule powers,
it'spolice powers to protect public health
and welfare and its specific authorization
under M.C.L. c.40, s.21 and 21D.

Section 2: Purpose

The purpose of this By-law is to protect,

preserve, and maintain the public health, safety and welfare whenever there is in force a state of water supply emergency by providing for enforcement of any duly imposed restrictions, requirements, provisions or conditions imposed by the Town of Templeton or by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection and included in the Town's plan approved by the Department of Environmental Protection to abate the emergency.

Section 3: Definitions

For the purpose of this By-law:

enforcement authority shall mean the Town's Board of Selectmen or Water Department, having responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the water supply, the Health Department, The Town police and the Special police.

state of water supply emergency shall mean a state of water supply emergency declared by the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to G.L. C.21G, section G.L. c. 111, s.160, or by the Governor.

Section 4: The following shall apply to all users of water supplies supplied by the Town.

Following notification by the Town of the existence of a state of water supply emergency, no person shall violate any provision, condition, requirement or restriction or restriction included in a plan approved by the Department of Environmental Protection which has as its purpose the abatement of a water supply emergency.

Notification of any provision, restriction, requirement, or condition with which users of water supplied by the Town are required to comply to abote a situation of water emergency shall be sufficient for purposes of this By-law if it is published in a newspaper of general circulation within the Town or by such other notice as is reasonably calculated to reach and inform all users of the Town supply.

Section 5: Penalty

Any person or entity who violates this By-Law, shall be liable to the Town in the

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amount of \$50.00 for the first violation and \$100.00 for each subsequent violation which shall inure to the Town for such uses as the Board of Selectmen may direct. Fines shall be recovered by indictment or on complaint before the District Court or by noncriminal disposition in accordance with section 21D of Chapter 40 of the General Laws. Each separate instance of non-compliance following the issuance of any warning or citation pursuant to this section shall constitute a separate violation.

Section 6. Right of Entry

Agents of the enforcement authority may enter any property for purpose of inspecting or investigating any violation of this By-law or enforcing the same, upon obtaining a warrant from a court having jurisdiction over the subject matter and area.

Section 7. Severability

The invalidity of any portion or provisions of this By-law shall not invalidate any other portion, provision or section hereof.

Article 2. On a motion duly made and seconded the Town voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to investigate taking, by eminent domain, the property formerly known as Mathews property located on Gavin Road (as listed on Assessors Map 4-13, Lot 14, and as described in a deed dated January 29, 1992 recorded in the Worcester District Registry of Deeds, Book #13928, Page 44), to locate the placement of a public waterwell for purposes of protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the Town's inhabitants.

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Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to Raise and Appropriate or Transfer a sum of money to initiate preliminary eminent domain proceedings, by determining the fair market value of the property formerly known as Mathews property located on Gavin Road (as listed on Assessors Map 4-13, Lot 14, Book #13928, Page 44, on Deed dated 1-29-92) to locate the placement of a public waterwell for purposes of protecting the health, safety, and welfare to the Town's inhabitants, and take any other action thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded the Town voted to Transfer from the Pilot Corrosion Control Program the sum of Five Thousand, Three Hundred Sixty Dollars and Fifty-two Cents (\$5,360.52) to initiate eminent domain proceedings, by determining the fair market value of the property formerly known as Mathews property located on Gavin Road (as listed on Assessors Map 4-13, Lot 14, and as described in a deed dated January 29, 1992 recorded in the Worcester District Registry of Deeds, Book #13928, Page 44), to locate the placement of a public waterwell for purposes of protecting the health, safety, and welfare to the Town's inhabitants.

Passed

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to Appropriate and transfer a sum of money from the Fire Department Payroll Account to the Fire Department Expense Account, or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded the Town voted to transfer Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00) from the Fire Department Payroll Account to the Fire Department Expense Account.

Passed

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to Transfer from the Insurance Recoveries Receipts Reserved for Appropriation Account, to the Highway Barn Addition Account, or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded the Town voted to Transfer Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) from the Insurance Recoveries Receipts Reserved for Appropriation Account, to the Highway Barn Addition Account.

Passed

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the May 10, 1994 Special Town Meeting vote of Article 1 to transfer the Worcester County Dog Fund receipts in the amount of Seven Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars and Eighty-five cents (\$777.85) to the Boynton Public Library Expense Account; or to take any other action action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded the Town voted to rescind the May 10, 1994 Special Town Meeting vote of Article 1 to transfer the Worcester County Dog Fund receipts in the amount of Seven Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars and Eighty-five cents (\$777.85) to the Boynton Public Library Expense Account; or to take any other action relative thereto.

Passed

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Worcester County Dog Fund receipts to the Boynton Public Library expense Account; or to take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded the Town voted to transfer Seven Hundred Eighty-three dollars and Seventy-eight cents (\$783.78) from the Worcester County Dog Fund receipts to the Boynton Public Library Expense Account.

And you are hereby directed to serve this warrant by posting attested copies thereof in each precinct; namely, at the Post Office in Templeton, the Post Office in East Templeton, the Post Office in Baldwinville, and at Cote's Market in Otter River, and by delivering a copy to each of the Precinct Clerks Seven (7) days at least before the time of holding said meeting and by causing notice of the same to be published once in the Gardner News, a newspaper in each County, in the City of Gardner.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon at the time and place of said meeting.
